**Gen Ed Requirements (please refer to the FAA Student Handbook Degree Requirements for official list) :**

- 6 credits of Quantitative Reasoning I and II
- 6 credits of Natural Sciences and Technology
- 6 credits of Social and Behavioral Sciences
- 6 credits of Cultural Studies (Western and non-Western Cultures)
- 9 credits of General non-Theatre Electives
- Minimum of 128 hours of credit for the degree. A maximum of 12 credit hours of Thea 400 can count towards the 128 minimum.

**Foreign Language Requirement:**

- To graduate, students must complete the equivalent of 3 semesters of college-level language. Depending on DARS, this may mean 1-3 semesters of a foreign language. Please refer to FAA Undergraduate Student Handbook for official requirement.

**Practicum Fall Semester for Freshmen:**

- Thea 100 Practicum Credit is given for crewing a production or working in a shop. Students who are interested may choose to PA on that same production for an additional credit of Thea 100 (attending rehearsals 2-3 days per week as a member of the stage management team), but this is done on a voluntary basis and is not required.

**Open Electives**

- The University requires students to take 11-14 credit hours of Open Electives. For BFA Stage Management majors, generally these are filled with additional credits of Thea 359 and Thea 450; and/or other Theatre Electives such as Thea 407 *Production Management* or Thea 409 *Stage Management Workshop*. Occasionally students will need to choose an additional elective course to meet the requirements of the Open Electives.
